She is Co-Chair of the RBHS Mentoring Committee and the founding chair of the Society of Surgical Chairs Women's Committee.



Nanci Tofsky has a Bachelor of Arts degree, a Master of Science degree and a Doctor of Dentistry degree. She did her residency in Pediatric Dentistry at Tufts New England Medical Center in Boston. She began her dental career at Englewood Hospital in NJ where she served as the dental residency director. She then became director of the residency program at Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital before joining the faculty of New Jersey Dental School, now known as Rutgers School of Dental Medicine. She has been a member of the faculty of the department of pediatric dentistry for 31 years. In addition, she is a member of the medical staff at University Hospital where she is an attending in Dental Medicine.

She also served for 10 years as the Chair of the APA Insurance Trust. In 2009, she was inducted in the Rutgers University Hall of Distinguished Alumni. She has been a member of the Board of Trustees of Rutgers and served as its Chair. Currently, she is a member of the Rutgers Board of Governors. Dr. Cantor has a private practice in Westfield, N.J. She has written or edited 6 books and numerous articles, focusing on women's issues and advocacy. Her most recent books are <u>Finding Your Voice</u> and <u>What Do You Want to Do When You Grow Up?</u>. She has also appeared as an expert on television shows, including Good Morning America, Prime Time Live, and the Today show, and on CNBC and the Fox News Channel. She is long married, and has two children and seven grandchildren.



Dr. Sandra (Sandy) Shullman is Managing Partner of the Columbus Office of the Executive Development Group, LLC, internationally known in leadership and executive assessment and development. She teaches leadership at the HEC School of Business for their EMBA and MBA programs in Paris, Doha, Beijing, and Shanghai, and also serves as faculty for the Duke University Fuqua School of Business Global Learning Network. Her distinguished record of organizational work experience has focused on leadership and executive development, executive coaching, strategic planning and multicultural and diversity initiatives, working with major global organizations and leaders. She is co-author of <u>Performance Appraisal on the Line</u>, a groundbreaking book on performance evaluation.
